Scoring

Only fully completed entries will be judged

A number system (1 through 10) will be used for the first six (6) questions (Section One)

A number system (1 through 10) will be used for the next three (3) questions (Section Two)

Each entry will be scored 1 through 10 for the overall entry

The top three (3) entries in each category will be interviewed and/or visited by member(s) of the committee

ALL ENTRY APPLICATIONS SHALL BE SUBMITTED ON (5) FIVE CD's
