



## 2021 NEACOP Annual Training Conference Instructor Biographies

***Detective Sergeant Kevin Connolly*** is a 24-year veteran of the Barnstable Police Department in Massachusetts. He has been federally deputized by the United States Marshalls as a United States Secret Service Task Force Officer assigned to the New England Cyber Fraud Task Force. Detective Sergeant Connolly has participated in and initiated both state and federal investigations to include homicides, sexual assaults, and child exploitation cases. He has also participated in two Title III federal wire-tap cases that targeted and dismantled high-level drug trafficking organizations on Cape Cod. Based on his participation in several of these investigations Detective Sergeant Connolly has received an Investigative Achievement Award from the United States Attorney's Office and a Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition from the United States Congress. He has instructed over 600 students on the subject of digital investigations as well as lectured at both the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Georgia and the National Cyber Crime Conference. Detective Sergeant Connolly holds a Master's Degree from Faulkner University in Justice Administration and is a ZetX Subject Matter Expert on call detail record and geolocation data analysis.

***Dr. Stephen A. Morreale*** is Chair and Professor of Criminal Justice at Worcester State University. Dr. Morreale served in law enforcement for 30 years, having retired as Assistant Special Agent in Charge for U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Investigations, Inspector General. For 20 years, he served with the Drug Enforcement Administration, serving as a special agent and managing agent in enforcement groups.

***Chief John Moore*** has spent his entire 29 career in the criminal justice field; first as a criminal defense attorney (1988-1995), and then as a police officer (1995-2017). He was the Chief of Police for Holliston, Massachusetts for the last six years of his career. Chief Moore is a member of the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association, IACP, NEACOP and FBI LEEDA. He has been an adjunct professor at Emmanuel College and Dean College in a variety of criminal justice subjects.

***Sean Varano, Ph.D.*** is a Professor in the School of Justice Studies at Roger Williams University. Dr. Varano's area of expertise are in law enforcement policy and practice, innovative approaches to violence reduction, youth gangs, and evaluation research. Dr. Varano is an active collaborator with local communities implementing and evaluating evidence-based approaches to crime and public health. Dr. Varano has also worked extensively throughout Massachusetts and Rhode Island on efforts to reduce the prevalence of intentional drug overdoses, particularly related to opiates.

***Pamela Kelley*** is the Executive Director of Kelley Research Associates, a private evaluation and research firm specializing in criminal justice and community service evaluation and research projects for local, state, and federal governmental agencies. Ms. Kelley has over twenty-nine years of experience in the field of research and evaluation. Ms. Kelley is an Associate Professor of Criminology at Stonehill College where she has taught for past seventeen years. Ms. Kelley has authored or co-authored over 100 evaluation and research technical reports.

***Chief Douglas F. Wyman, Jr.*** has been a police officer for 30 years in New Hampshire and was the Chief of the Sandwich, New Hampshire Police Department for the last ten years. He is currently the Chief of Campus Police, Worcester Recovery Center and Hospital. Chief Wyman is a graduate of all three levels of the Command training Series at Roger Williams University. He was a member of the Executive Board of Directors for the New England Association of Chiefs of Police.

***Chief John Monaghan, III*** has worked as a city police officer and State trooper. In 2012 John became the Chief of Police in Franconia NH helping bridge the gap between department and community. John was also the Chief of Moultonborough, NH. He is currently the Director of Partnerships for All Aces, Inc. He is passionate about training those in policing to use their role as officers to lead the communities they serve by being role models of respect, equity and fairness.

***Dr. Benjamin Stone*** Upon graduation from the University of Arkansas, Dr. Benjamin Stone attended Exeter College of Oxford University through the United States Air Force Institute of Technology. At Oxford, Dr. Stone developed a keen interest in cardiovascular physiology. He completed his PhD and related coursework for his medical doctorate and also coordinated research at the British Olympic Medical Institute, Oxford Nutraceuticals Group, and Cambridge University. Dr. Stone served as Assistant Professor of Exercise Physiology at the University of Central Arkansas, Sr. Tutor at Oxford University, and designed curriculums for the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

In 2017, Dr. Stone co-developed Sigma Tactical Wellness, an organization intent on determining the causes-of and reducing the prevalence of coronary disease in law enforcement officers throughout the United States. To date, his program has screened more than 5000 police officers and the derived data and methods are being used across the nation to save countless lives.

As a well-regarded lecturer, Dr. Stone has presented data at the International Association of Chiefs of Police conference, Texas Chiefs Association, The FBI National Academy, and many other state, local, and federal law-enforcement agencies.
