

LIFE SAVING AWARDS

Captain Tyler Domingos, *Foster RI PD*

On April 14th 2022, Captain Tyler Domingos responded to a residence in the Town of Foster in reference to a male that had barricaded himself inside of the residence, intending to commit suicide.

Capt. Domingos took up a safe position on the property and was able to speak with this individual through an open window. After building rapport with this individual, Capt. Domingos was able to get this male's cellphone number.

After speaking on the phone for several hours, Capt. Domingos was able to get this male to surrender himself peacefully and receive psychological help.

During this highly stressful incident, Capt. Domingos with calm cool headedness poise and understanding, was able to speak with this man and get him the psychological help he needed, without the individual harming himself or others.

Officer Michael Carrier, *New Bedford, MA PD*



On January 20, 2022, New Bedford Police Officer Michael Carrier was conducting a wellness check at the residence of a reportedly suicidal person. While entering the home, he observed the male seated in an adjacent room, with the barrel of a pistol in his mouth. Ofc. Carrier attempted to engage the man in conversation to establish a rapport. The man would not respond.

Acting quickly, decisively, and with great risk of peril to himself, Officer Carrier seized an opportunity to move in, take hold of the weapon, and disarm the man, who was later taken to the hospital for treatment.

Officer Carrier's heroic actions during this call were exemplary. His commitment to the safety and well-being of this distressed person was extraordinary. If it weren't for the outstanding compassion and bravery of Officer Carrier, both he and the involved party could have been shot and wounded and/or killed.

On behalf of the 2021 Community Policing Awards Committee please accept this report from members; Chiefs Patrick Jones, Mark Chase, Robert Cormier, Kevin Schofield, Paul Satkowski, Fred Fredrickson, Mr. David Lambert, P.H.D. Roger Williams University School of Justice Studies and myself.

On January 20, 2022 the application period began by a posting on the Association's web site as well as notifications via email was sent to all active members with a deadline of March 31, 2022.

There were four (4) qualified Departments that submitted applications. Each Committee member was asked to review and evaluate the applications and return their evaluation by June 10th. The scores were combined with these results.

Departments serving a population of 15,000 to 30,000.

1st place: Mashpee Police Department, Massachusetts, Chief Scott Carline

2nd place: University of New Hampshire Police Department, Chief Paul Dean

Departments serving a population under 15,000.

1st place: Sturbridge Police Department, Massachusetts, Chief Earl Dessert

2nd place: Stratham Police Department, New Hampshire, Chief Anthony King

Mr. David Lambert was able to secure Roger Williams University, School of Justice Studies as a sponsor for the 1st place award to Mashpee P.D. Chief Kevin Schofield secured Coastal Electronics of Wiscasset Maine, as a sponsor for the 1st place award to Sturbridge P.D.

The cost of each award was \$214.00. The awards were ordered on July 8, 2022 from Crown Trophy.

On July 11th on behalf of the Committee I sent letters and certificates informing the Chiefs of Police from those four Departments with their respective results.

On July 19th I shipped the two 1st place awards along with certificates to the Vice President for Massachusetts Gary Thomann for his presentation to those Chiefs.

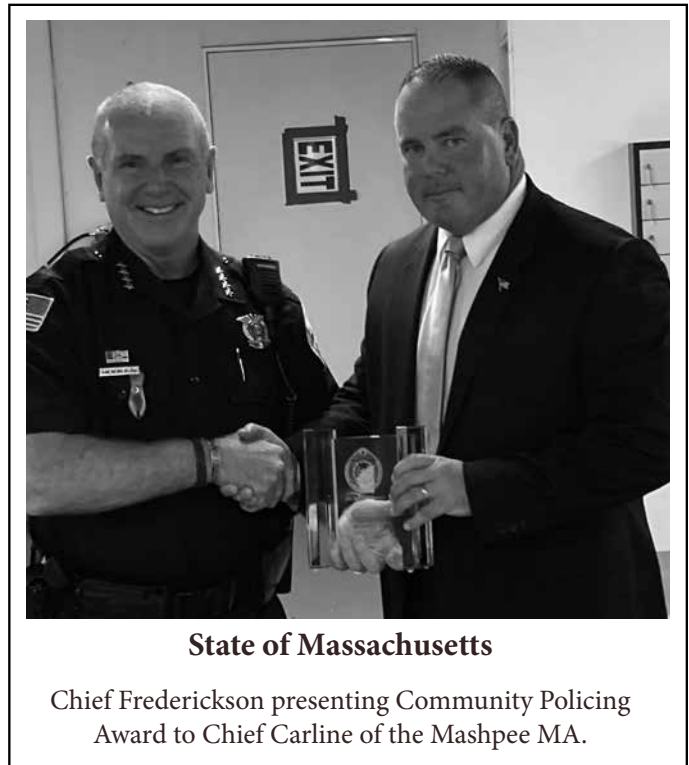

In Memory of Chief Jack Coyle, Executive Director Emeritus



NORTH ATTLEBORO — Retired police chief John D. Coyle Jr., the very embodiment of the North Attleboro Police Department, was remembered Friday for instilling a spit-and-polish image and guiding the agency into the modern era.

Coyle, who was the town's fourth police chief for 28 years until he retired on his 68th birthday in 1999, died Thursday night at a hospice center in Providence. He was 91.

"Chief Coyle is a legend. An iconic figure in policing and as a resident of the town of North Attleboro," Police Chief Richard McQuade said Friday.

McQuade was hired by Coyle as a police dispatcher and a year later as a police officer, starting out his career in the old Mason Avenue police station.

"He was a strict disciplinarian who demanded professionalism from his officers. The spit-and-polish image that he instilled within the North Attleboro police

department is still adhered to today," McQuade said.

Coyle was a police lieutenant in command of the detective squad when he was appointed chief in December 1970 at age 39 after Police Chief Stanley Lykus shot himself in his office.

When Coyle joined the police department in 1955, the cruisers had police radios that could receive calls but not transmit them before the department got walkie-talkies a couple of years later.

By the time he retired, police cruisers were equipped with portable laptop computers. He was hired when police lacked training and later served on the Massachusetts Criminal Justice Training Council, which set police standards and policies.

He was proud to call himself a true townie, boasting of being born at his parent's home on Peck Street. He lived in the same house on Smith Street for over 60 years.

Although a police chief in a small community, Coyle was known far beyond North Attleboro.

He was an executive member of several professional organizations even after his retirement, including the International Association of Police Chiefs and the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association.

He retired in 2020 after serving 38 years as executive director of the New England Association of Chiefs of Police. In recognition of his lengthy service, he was named executive director emeritus of the organization.

"For a small town police chief he was well known in law enforcement throughout the country," retired North Attleboro police Lt. David Dawes said.

Dawes, who was hired by Coyle and was a longtime detective, said the chief had numerous contacts throughout law enforcement, including the FBI and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration.

"You mention North Attleboro to the FBI or and DEA they would get you anything you needed," Dawes said.

The retired police officer stayed in touch with his mentor and got to reminisce with him a couple of weeks ago.

"He'll be missed throughout the law enforcement community. It's a sad day for the North Attleboro Police Department," Dawes said.

When he was chief, Coyle made the department in his own image: spit and polish. Officers were clean-shaven with close-cropped hair.

Hats worn at all times outdoors and the uniforms crisp, creased and squared-off. Shoes polished to a high luster.

He instilled a military regimen in the department, something he kept with him from his service in the U.S. Navy during the Korean War and in the Marine Reserves.

He arrived at the Mason Avenue police station at 4 a.m., washed police cruisers and worked out every morning in the basement gym. A devout Catholic, he also attended Mass daily.

"He epitomized what dedication to duty was. He epitomized the badge," said retired North Attleboro detective Daniel Arrighi, who was hired by Coyle as a 23-year-old officer and kept in touch with him.

May he rest in Peace.

CODE OF ETHICS

For Police Executives

NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE, INC.



We, members of the New England Association of Chiefs of Police, Inc., recognizing our responsibilities to the communities we serve and our obligations to society in general and with the knowledge that our profession requires the highest ideals and rules of conduct, hereby adopt the following code of ethics for police executives, and commend them to all persons in the police profession for their guidance.

We will put honesty, truth and justice above all other considerations, and we will not allow friendship, enmity, social position, political influence, nor personal motives to swerve us from the impartial performance of duty.

We will neither solicit nor accept, any gift, privilege, favor or advantage from any person which will place us under any obligation to overlook any violation of a law, or violate the ethics of our profession.

We will observe all the provisions of the Constitution of the United States, and will never illegally deprive any person of any right guaranteed by the great document. We will not become involved in any social, political, or religious controversy except as neutral agents of the public, and we will at all times endeavor to carry out the desires of the majority of citizens as legally expressed through proper legislative, judicial or executive channels of government.

Having efficient police administration as our objective, we recognize the need for professional fitness on the part of police executives and subordinates. We pledge ourselves to advance the science of police service through training courses and other methods adequate to meet the proper requirements of our profession.

Recognizing the mutual dependence of all law enforcement and social agencies, we pledge our cooperation to all officials and agencies interested in the promotion of justice and the improvement of social conditions. We will not allow envy, jealousy, or any other motive to interfere with such cooperation.

We will be fair with subordinates showing only that favor which has been honestly earned by meritorious service to the public: demanding that all police officers perform their duties and enforce the laws with impartiality, judgment and courtesy.

We recognize our responsibility to the press as a medium through which the public we serve can be kept informed of our activities. We solicit its support in all honest police endeavor, and its condemnation of any act or policy detrimental to the best interests of society. We deplore violations of the code of ethics for journalism in connection with publication of police news and respectfully recommend observance of that code.

NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION CHIEFS OF POLICE INCORPORATED BRIEF HISTORY

- The New England Association of Chiefs of Police founded in 1926 and incorporated 13th of February , 1939 in the state of Rhode Island.
- In 1933, Michael Healy, Chief of Police of Manchester, NH, was the first elected representative President from the state of NH.
- The first organized conference was held at the Parker House, Boston, MA in 1939.
- The second and third conferences were held in northern New England in 1940 at the Hotel Burlington in VT and the second at 1941 at the Mt. Washington in Brentonwoods, NH. For the next four decades most of the conferences were held in northern New England.
- NEACOP has over three and a half decades in northern New England
- In 1967, Thomas McLaughlin training office at the FBI Boston office and the president of Babson College formed a partnership for advance training for superior officers in the New England states. Police training at this not a priority in the law enforcer field.
- The program resulted in over 16,000 supervisory officers trained in numerous programs over the next 35 years.
- The command training institute of law enforcement management was a condensed program mirrored after the national FBI academy at Quantico, VA.
- The first director of the academy was Bruno Wilson, retired from the FBI Boston office. In his third year as a director, Director Wilson, had a massive heart attack while jogging during his lunch break. He died at the age of 48.
- At that point Deputy Chief Arthur Kehas of Manchester, NH Police Department was appointed as director.
- After two years, Deputy Chief Kehas left the program and returned to Manchester PD.
- After the departure of Chief Kehas, the next three and half decades Retired superintendents from the Boston PD was appointed as Directors of the program. Deputy Superintendent John Holland of the Boston Police Department was the first in succession.
- Followed by Charles Barry
- John Krecler was last in succession
- In April 2003, the President of Babson College informed the Association that the facilities at Woodland Park would now be used to house an engineering college. Therefore, the Association would need to relocate off campus.
- The University of Massachusetts at Brockton, MA offered a new location for the program . Recognizing the program worthy of receiving college credits.
- Retired Major Gerald Burke of the MA State Police agreed to take on the role as the new director.
- In 2003, Director Burke informed the Association he was resigning from the program to train police officers in Iraq. This resulted in a partnership with Roger Williams University of Bristol, RI.
- In partnership with the Justice System Training and Research Institute at Roger Williams University, Bristol, RI, the Association continues a tradition that began in 1967 with the New England Institute for Law Enforcement Management to expand training and education, particularly in specialized management and leadership principles for law enforcement supervisor, command officers, managers, and administration.
- Associate Dean Robert McKenna was appointed as director to continue this program.
- January 2018, Associate Dean Robert McKenna, M.S., J.D., retired and David Lambert, Ph.D., took over as Director for the JSTRI and Assistant Dean for the school of Justice, July 1, 2018.
- The Association sponsors scholarships to the Command Training Series at Roger Williams University and makes annual contributions to the Jimmy Fund, Special Olympics, as well as, other charitable causes.
- The Association continues to live out its legacy by providing education and development to create tomorrow's officers.

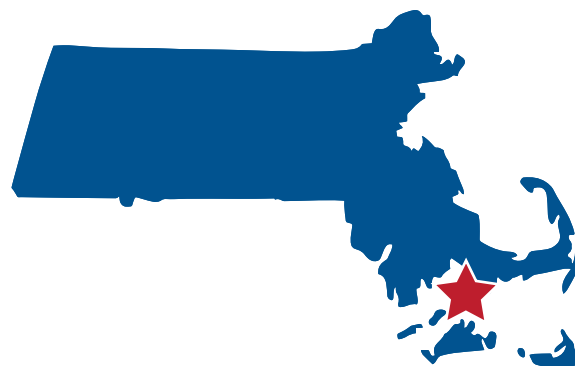
